HOME SAFETY

Make sure your exterior doors & windows have high quality locks and deadbolts.

Never allow a stranger in your home. Ask for identification even from service workers allowing entry.

Never let anyone know you're alone in a house.

If a stranger requests help, offer to call 911 while they wait outside.

Never reveal any personal information to strangers on the internet nor to unknown callers.

When out of town, do not advertise that your residence is empty. Cease all mail deliveries until further notice.

VEHICLE SAFETY

Always park in a well-lit area & always ensure your car is empty before entry.

When not in use, lock your doors and roll your windows up. The doors should be locked while driving too.

If someone tries to get into your car, drive off and honk the horn for attention.

If your car is disabled in an isolated area, raise the hood and wait in your car until help arrives.

If you think you are being followed, do not drive home. Drive to a well populated area.

Never pick up any strangers or hitchhickers.

Keep an old cell phone and charger in your car so you can call 9-1-1 in an emergency.

DEFENDING YOURSELF

If your home looks like it was broken into while you were out, **DO NOT ENTER** or **CALL OUT**. Someone may still be inside. Call 911 immediately.

If attacked inside your home, try to get outside where your screams can be heard. In any dangerous situation, be sure to scream and yell for help if you can.

If you are outside, flag down a passing car. You want to capture the attention of anyone that's within the area.

To defend yourself, use any available object for a weapon.

Dial 9-1-1 and leave the phone off the hook if you're unable to speak.

Carry a personal alarm, or consider enabling emergency notifications features on your mobile device.
