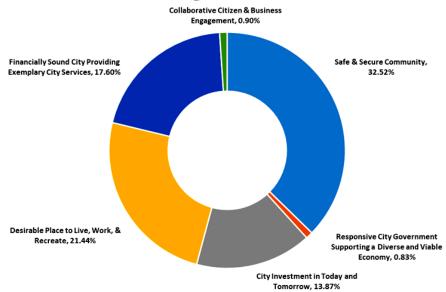


Collaborative Citizen & Business Engagement

FY 2020 Annual Adopted Budget by Strategic Goal Total Budget \$261,439,592



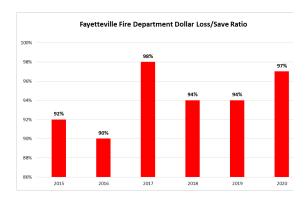

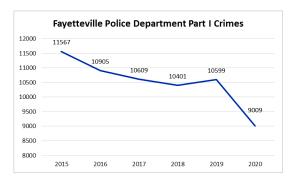

GOAL II Diverse and Viable Economy



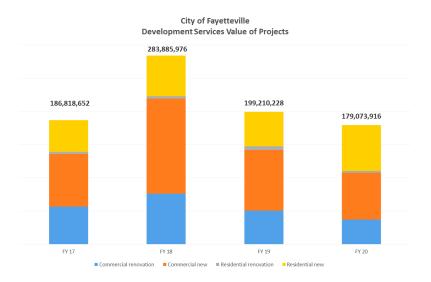
- Business support and technical assistance provided to over 270 clients by the Economic and Community Development department

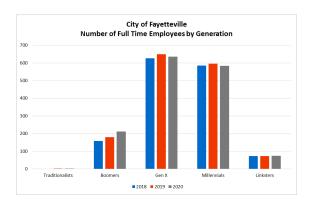
