3.0 ITEM OF BUSINESS

3.1 Update on the Proposed North Carolina Civil War History Center

Ms. Mary Lynn Bryan, Member of the Board of Directors of the North Carolina Civil War History Center, presented the executive summary from ConsultEcon Inc., Economic and Research and Management Consultants.

Mr. John (Mac) Healy, President of the Board of Directors of the North Carolina Civil War History Center, presented the Economic and Fiscal Impacts due to the North Carolina Civil War History Center (NCCWHC) with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation and stated the estimated cost of the NCCWHC is \$65 million. The Board of Directors is asking the City and the County to pledge \$7.5 million each for a total of \$15 million, and stated the Legislature has told the Board that in order to continue and receive state funding, the local community (City of Fayetteville and Cumberland County) has to demonstrate their support by way of pledging funding; without your support we cannot move forward.
