# 6.07 Budget Ordinance Amendment 2017-2 to Appropriate \$250,000.00 of Available Fiscal Year 2016 Budgeted Funding for the Police Department

Budget Ordinance Amendment 2017-2 will appropriate \$250,000.00 for the Police Department to fund software and equipment purchases. Carryover of this budgeted funding was anticipated in fund balance projections reviewed with Council during budget deliberations. The \$250,000.00 will be reflected as assigned fund balance in the financial statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016.

### 6.08 Authorize Service Contract with Mott MacDonald for Park Bond Program Project Management

The funding for this service will come from the Parks Bond CIP. These services are appropriate for capitalization as part of the construction of the bond projects. A Capital Project Ordinance has been placed on this agenda providing up to \$100,000.00 in appropriation to support the execution of this contract. The proposed contract is for a lump sum amount of \$91,500.00.

### 6.09 Gateway Committee Request to PWC - Irrigation for Median Projects

The FY 17 Budget contains a total of \$477,500.00 in CIP funds to support all costs associated with these median projects.

- FY 16 CIP \$152,500.00
- FY 17 CIP \$250,000.00
- FY 18 CIP \$75,000.00

## 6.10 Adoption of Capital Project Fund Ordinance Amendment 2017-20 for the Downtown Parking Deck

This project was initially established in 2010 for the construction of the Downtown Parking Deck which has been completed. Capital Project Fund Ordinance Amendment 2017-20 will appropriate \$1,900.00 in remaining investment income earned on the debt proceeds to be used for related debt service payments, and will allow for future closeout of the project.

### 6.11 Interlocal Contract for Cooperative Purchasing

Through the Purchasing Department, Fayetteville Fire/Emergency Management will purchase a fire engine and a ladder truck in FY 17. Over the past six years the department has purchased fire apparatus through the Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC) cooperative contract. HGAC is a cooperative purchasing agency that has a competitive bidding process with manufacturers of fire apparatus. This request is to continue to purchase apparatus through the HGAC contract.

### 6.12 Capital Project Ordinance 2017-12 for Development of an Implementation and Funding Plan for the Parks & Recreation Bond Projects

Project management services are needed in order to develop a detailed implementation and funding plan for the Parks and Recreation Bond Projects. Capital Project Ordinance 2017-12 will appropriate \$100,000.00 of initial funding for the development of these plans. The recommended source of funding is the use of anticipated bond proceeds.

### 7.0 PUBLIC FORUM

Mr. Steve Harper, 5707 Bashford Court, Fayetteville, NC, stated he has standing water in front of his house that has been there since mid-May due to the drains being clogged and expressed concerns over mosquito breeding in the stagnant water.

Ms. Kylee Medeiros, 1103 Lake Mont Court, Fayetteville, NC, expressed concerns over the flooding of a storm drain located next to her home, and stated she and her husband are refusing to sign the settlement agreement with the City.

Mr. Iman Eronomy Smith, 2700 Murchison Road, Fayetteville, NC, commented on the state of Fayetteville.

Mr. Mauro Bazan, 1035 Liberty Lane, Fayetteville, NC, stated he purchased his home a year ago, and since then it has been flooded five times. He stated Corner Stone, the developer, is refusing to help. The home has no electricity, and he and his family are no longer able to live in the house due to the deplorable condition of the \$289,000.00 brand new house, and asked for help.

### 9.0 OTHER ITEMS OF BUSINESS

9.01 City Council Authorization to Amend NC Department of Transportation Grant #362344.27.13.1 for Secondary Runway 10/28 Rehabilitation and Lighting, Adoption of Capital Project Ordinance Amendment 2017-19 and Capital Project Ordinance Closeout 2017-1, and Authorization for the Interim City Manager to Execute a Construction Contract with Barnhill Construction Co.

Mr. Brad Whited, Airport Director, presented this item and stated the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has approved additional grant funding for the construction phase of the project to rehabilitate the secondary runway paving and replace runway lights. Staff requests that Council authorize execution of the grant amendment, when awarded, and adopt Capital Project Ordinance Amendment 2017-19 to appropriate \$3,493,847.00 in additional state grant funds and \$388,206.00 for the required local match. The total project budget will be increased to \$4,131,793.00, to include the construction phase along with the design, bid, and environmental assessment phases already funded and completed. Council is also asked to adopt Capital Project Ordinance Closeout 2017-1 to allow for the use of \$349,000.00 that had previously been appropriated for local match funding for future NCDOT grants for this project. Finally, Council is asked to authorize the City Manager to execute a contract for construction with Barnhill Contracting Co., the lowest responsible bidder at a total of \$3,595,954.50, with a DBE percentage of 6.7 percent.
